## See the City from the Top of the World's Tallest Tower

Visitors to Toronto, Ontario can feel like they are standing on air when they visit the observation deck of the CN Tower. The elephant proof glass floor lets you see the ground 1815 feet below. This is a must see for any tourist.

Construction of the CN Tower began in 1973 and opened to the public in 1976. The concrete and steel structure was built by the Canadian National Railway as a radio and television broadcast tower. It has a large antenna on the very top making it the tallest building.

Visitors to the CN Tower will not want to miss eating at the revolving restaurant which is 1000 feet above the busy street below.

### Just the Facts:

- The CN Tower is the tallest building and free standing structure in the world
- The CN Tower cost \$63 million to build
- It took 1537 workers to build the tower
- Three times a year the staircase is opened for charity stair-climb events.
- The fastest climb on record is 7 minutes and 52 seconds in 1989 by Brendan Keenoy
- In 2002, Canadian Olympian & Paralympics Champion Jeff Adams climbed the stairs in a specially designed wheelchair.
